# **Golf Program Information and Regulations**

## **Golf Committee Roles & Responsibilities**

The Golf Committee shall establish all rules and regulations pertaining to the use of the golf course. It also has the ultimate responsibility for all the personnel involved with the golf program.

The committee has the final authority for any questions arising over the golf rules. The committee establishes the rules governing “local play” based on the regulations of the United States Golf Association. The committee has all jurisdiction over eligibility, scheduling and running of tournaments and the responsibility for all prizes.

The committee shall assist the Golf Professional in the selection of such prizes. The Committee shall consult with the House Committee to coordinate its activities in all of the events requiring clubhouse facilities. It shall also coordinate with the Green Committee so that the course maintenance does not interfere with scheduled activities.

## **Golf Shop Hours**

The golf shop will open a 1/2 hour before the first available tee time each day. The shop will close at the following times:

Course Opening - May 14 - 6:00 pm  
May 15 - Labor Day - 7:00 pm  
Labor Day - September 30 - 6:30 pm  
October 1 - October 31 - 6:00 pm  
November - Course closure - 5:00 pm

Shop hours will be extended as needed when there are leagues or other competitive events ongoing.

## **Driving Range Hours**

The driving range will open as early in the year as field conditions will allow for avoidance of unreasonable ball loss, and acceptable conditions for retrieval. The range will close towards the end of November based upon field / weather conditions. The range will open daily 1/2 hour before the first tee time, whether the time is filled or not, and will remain open until dusk, with the exception of Mondays. On Mondays the range will open at 11:00 to allow for handpicking and maintenance.



## **Golf Fees**

### **Cart Fees**

9 Holes - \$11 (including tax) per person  
18 Holes - \$21 (including tax) per person

Push carts are available on a first come, first served basis. Push carts may be used at all times. Players may also use their own push or electric assist carts, but said carts must be approved by the professional staff. The walk fee will apply.

- Anyone playing at least (6) holes will be charged for (9) holes.
- Anyone playing (11) holes or more will be charged for (18) holes.

\$15.00/per person (Normal cart fees apply)

### **Fall Special**

Weekdays September 8 - October 31  
Weekdays and weekends after November 1  
18 Hole Cart & Green Fees - \$45/Per Person

## **Walking\*\***

Walking privileges are limited to members and guests of junior members. All other players must take a golf cart.

### **Hours**

- Any time November through April
- Any time Monday through Friday
- Weekends and Holidays after 3 PM
- Anytime golf carts are restricted to cart paths

### **Fees**

9 Holes- \$5.00  
18 Holes- \$10.00

Members may walk without fees at the following times:

Apr 1 - July 30 - After 6 PM  
Aug 1 - Sept 30 - After 5:30 PM  
Oct 1 - Nov 30 - After 5 PM

Any time the course is restricted to temporary greens

## **Etiquette**

Golf is truly a “gentleman’s game” and failure by any player or spectator to observe the courtesies which are part of the game can seriously affect the enjoyment and scores of other players. Careful observance of these courtesies is as much a part of the game as accurate scoring or the observance of any other rules of golf. Some of the rules of golf etiquette are listed here for your guidance.

### **Courtesy on the Course**

- In the interest of all, players should play without delay. Glen Oak Country Club’s Pace of play policy follows this section. Please take the time to familiarize yourself with it as pace of play is closely monitored.
- Players searching for a ball should signal the players behind them to pass as soon as it becomes apparent that the ball will not easily be found. Never look for a ball for more than three minutes.
- No player should play until the players in front are out of range. We request your observance of true sportsmanship and courtesy to the groups in front and behind.
- When the play of a hole has been completed, players should immediately leave the putting green. Keep pace with the group in front.
- No one should move, talk or stand close to or directly behind the ball or hole when a player is addressing the ball or making a stroke.
- Faster groups should be invited to play through when appropriate, except during tournament play or other times when the course is particularly busy. All groups must still adhere to Glen Oak’s Pace of Play policy.
- When the course is busy slower groups must keep position on the course, which may require skipping holes, rather than allowing a series of groups to play through.

Note: The proper place on the golf course is immediately behind the group in front of you-- not in front of the group behind you.

## **Glen Oak Pace of Play Rules**

Maintaining a reasonable pace of play when using the golf course is critical to ensuring the enjoyment of the facilities by all members of the club. Recreational play, leagues, and tournaments will each have their own specific policies, tailored to the format, participants, and prevailing course conditions. While it is anticipated that the target times will be met in most circumstances, the following procedures will be followed in the event of a breach of the policies.

### Consequences for Repeated Breaches of Target Pace or Decorum

#### Letter Process

First Offense – Letter of warning issued by the Head Golf Professional and Golf Chairman identifying the date of the violation. This is in addition to any penalties incurred during league and tournament play.

Second Offense – Second letter issued instructing the golfer to meet with the President, Head Golf Professional and Golf Chairman to discuss the continued slow play behavior and suggested remedies to prevent future occurrences. Meeting to take place within one (1) week of 2nd offense. This is in addition to any penalties incurred during league and tournament play.

Third Offense – Third letter issued outlining the loss of Golf Privileges to be decided by the President and Golf Chairman, which may include loss of tee times before 11:00 AM for 15 Days and/or loss of tournament eligibility for certain events; not to include the Jackman Memorial. This is in addition to any penalties incurred during league and tournament play.

Repeat offenders in leagues may be limited to later tee times for future matches.

Any altercation initiated by a member against a ranger or member of the staff in response to a pace of play warning will result in a suspension of golf privileges for a period of time to be determined by the BOD and Golf Chairman.

During open play the following are the maximum allowable round times:

No cart path restrictions: 4 hours, 10 minutes

Carts restricted on selected holes: 4 hours, 20 minutes

Carts restricted to paths: 4 hours, 30 minutes

Tournaments and leagues will be governed by separate policies specific to the event.

## **Dress Code**

Proper attire is required on the golf course, clubhouse, practice area and the putting green at all times.

For men, slacks or Bermuda length shorts, proper footwear, and collared shirts or appropriate mock turtleneck is required. Cargo shorts, while not prohibited, are discouraged.

For ladies, slacks, skorts, skirts and Bermuda length shorts of an appropriate length are required

Prohibited at all times: blue jeans, tennis shorts, sweat suits, bathing suits, short shorts, cut-offs or biker shorts, and tights and yoga pants unless worn under another garment.

Any person, whether member or guest, who does not comply with this dress code shall be prohibited from playing or practicing on the golf course or practice range.

The Golf Professional and his Staff have been instructed to strictly enforce this code.

## **Registration**

All players must register in the Golf Shop before beginning play and must have their own bags and clubs. The starting point for all play is the 1st tee. Permission to start on a hole other than No.1 may be granted only by the professional staff.

## **Starting Times**

Tee times can be made via the Glen Oak website [www.glenoakcc.com](http://www.glenoakcc.com) using Foretees. The direct link to the Glen Oak Foretees page is [www.foretees.com/glenoakcc](http://www.foretees.com/glenoakcc)

Tee times for weekends and holidays can be requested up to one week in advance on Foretees. The actual assignment of tee times follows an electronic lottery performed by Foretees on Thursday mornings. (All advance requests made by senior members are treated equally in the lottery - no seniority or other system of preference is used.)

The assigned starting times can be viewed on Thursdays at 8 am. An e-mail will also be sent to members notifying them of their starting times. Tee times for all other days may be made starting at 8 am, one week prior to the desired day.

While use of Foretees is recommended, requests for starting times can also be made by telephone and “in-person”; however, these requests will be accepted no earlier than 8 am Thursday for the upcoming weekend/holiday.

## **Using Foretees**

If you have questions about use of Foretees or would like a demonstration, the Golf Shop staff will be happy to assist you.

The Glen Oak website can be accessed from any computer with access to the internet. Foretees offers numerous advantages in managing tee times. Please take a few minutes to familiarize yourself with its features - you'll be glad you did!

## **Guest Play**

The following guidelines govern guest play at Glen Oak Country Club:

- A member may host up to 3 guests at a time
- A member must play in the group, except as noted below
- Guests are limited to 8 plays per year, excluding the Jackman Memorial Tournament
- Guest records will be kept April 1-October 15
- A member may bring up to 7 guests with the prior approval of the golf professional or the club manager. The prevailing guest rate at the time the group plays will apply.

## **Social Members**

Social Members are guests on the golf course (see above) and are entitled to play 8 rounds per year as a guest of a Glen Oak golf member. Any tournament rounds played, other than in the Jackman Memorial, will count toward this 8 round limit. Starting on the Tuesday after Labor Day, and continuing until the golf course closes for the season, social members may host guests on the golf course. Social members will continue to pay guest fees for themselves, as well as for their guests, at the prevailing rate. Rounds played will count toward the social member's limit of 8 plays per year.

## **Junior Golf**

Glen Oak is committed to the continued promotion of junior golf at the club. A robust junior golf program is not only a service to existing members, but a way of cultivating the next generation of club members. In 2021 we will continue to build on the successes of last year, while teaching our junior members to respect the traditions of the game and the club.

## **Junior Golf Schedule**

Clinics and instructional opportunities for all ages and abilities will be offered late Spring through the Summer. Program specifics will be communicated as they become available.

### **Parent-Child Tournament**

Sunday, June 20th -Make own tee times

### **Junior Member Guest**

Thursday, July 8th Tee times 10-1, depending on age.

### **Junior Club Championship**

Sunday, September 12th, Afternoon tee times  
(Championship division will play 36 holes' over  
Saturday & Sunday of Labor Day Weekend)



## **Junior Hours**

Juniors must be certified by the Golf Pro Staff to play unaccompanied on the golf course. Uncertified juniors must pass a short written test on safety and etiquette and on-course orientation by the professional staff to become certified. Ages 6-11 must be accompanied by a parent or guardian on the golf course, driving range or putting greens and will follow junior hours. Juniors may be allowed to play with adults/parents on weekends at the discretion of the professional staff. The number of players on the course will determine if juniors may play before 3:00pm on weekends and weekdays.

Listed below are general timeframes when course use is light enough to allow for junior golf. Juniors may be able to play outside of these hours with the permission of the golf staff. Unaccompanied junior golfers should contact the golf shop to schedule their rounds.

**MONDAY** - May play anytime.

**TUESDAY** - During league season after 6:00pm.  
Before and after league Season after 3:00pm.

**WEDNESDAY**- During league season after 6:00pm.  
Before and after league Season before 10:00  
and after 3:00pm.

**THURSDAY**- During league Season after 6:00pm.  
Before and after league season after 3:00pm.

**FRIDAY**- Before 10:00am and after 3:00pm.

**SATURDAY AND SUNDAY**- After 3:00pm.

## **Golf Cart Operations**

- You must be 16 years of age to operate a golf cart. A valid driver's license is required
- No more than (2) players and (2) bags are permitted on a golf cart
- Keep all golf carts at least 15 yards from all greens, tees and bunkers unless on a cart path.
- Cart paths should be used wherever they have been provided. All four tires of the golf cart should be on the cart paths around tees and greens. Golf cart traffic schedule will be posted for daily cart use.
- Carts may not be driven on the public roads, except to cross the public roads at the designated areas, i.e., crossing from #2 to #3, #5 to #6, #6 to #7, #8 to #9, #10 to #11 and #14 to #15. Golf cart users must heed all golf cart directions, signs and prohibitions.
- No more than two people may occupy a golf cart.
- Golf carts may not be driven on the Club lawns or walkways near the Swimming Pool or Grill Room.
- Operators of golf carts are responsible for the condition of the golf cart while in service. Carts must be returned in same condition as they were taken. Members are responsible for any damage during their use.
- All golf carts must be returned to the Bag Room area by sunset.
- Golf carts are never to be left on the golf course without being reported to the Golf Shop.
- The Club shall not be liable for any injuries or damages incurred by users of golf carts.
- Any infraction of these rules shall be grounds for suspension of playing privileges.

## **Lightning Guidelines**

Glen Oak utilizes a lightning prediction and detection system for your protection. The siren is activated when the system indicates that the course should be cleared due to the incidence or the threat of lightning. Please be reminded the prediction of lightning is not an exact science; therefore, Glen Oak cannot assume responsibility in the event of injury.

The following rules must be followed to help insure safety:

- Sirens or horns indicate lightning in the area.
- All golfers **MUST STOP** play and practice immediately. Mark your ball and either go directly to the clubhouse or the cart shed on hole #6.
- Golfers may **NOT** continue until an All Clear siren has sounded.

## **Bag Drop**

The bag drop is located at the end of the parking lot adjacent to the 9th green. Please trigger the bag drop monitoring system to alert staff that you have clubs for pick up. Glen Oak Country Club and its employees are not responsible for clubs left at the bag drop.

## **Food and Beverages**

Food and beverages not purchased from the club are not allowed for consumption anywhere on Glen Oak property. Members and their guests are encouraged not to consume alcoholic beverages on the golf course.

## Tournament Play

U.S.G.A. Rules of Golf shall govern play at all times, except when modified by a local rule. The decision of the Golf Professional or his designated representative on any matter in tournament or non-tournament play shall be final.

All golfers, especially those participating in tournaments are strongly encouraged to familiarize themselves with the USGA Rules of Golf, and the recent changes to them.

Visit [www.usga.org](http://www.usga.org) for further information on the rules of golf and the changes for 2020.

The professional staff will gladly render any assistance required in understanding and applying the Rules of Golf.

## Tournament Eligibility

All participants in Glen Oak tournaments, including the Jackman Memorial, must be at least 17 years old.

**In the following tournaments all participants must be Senior or Associate Members:**

Club Championships, Oliver Moon Memorial, Glen Oak Memorial.

### Addendum

The Guidelines for Junior Member participant's in tournaments are as follows:

- Summer Championship (Gold Division Only)  
16 years of age and older (7) handicap index and lower.

### Member-Member

- 16 years of age and older with immediate family member only.
- 18 years of age and older and a graduate of high school with any member.

## **Jackman Memorial**

- 17 years of age with immediate family.
- 18 years of age and a graduate of high school with any member.

## **Fall Classic**

- 16 years of age with family member.
- 18 years of age and graduate of high school with any member.

## **One Day Member Guest**

- 18 years of age and high school graduate

## **Club Championship and Match Play Championship (Championship Division only)**

- 17 years of age and high school graduate, 7 handicap index and lower.

Participating juniors will be required to enter the Tournament Prize Fund.

## **Jackman Memorial**

The Jackman Memorial is open to all male Senior or Associate Members. Seniority qualification will be based on the following:

- A. Seniority will be based on the length of continuous Senior or Associate Membership.
- B. An approved leave of absence or a change to Social status of 2 years or less will not affect a member's seniority.
- C. Ties for continuous membership will be broken by:
  1. Date of acceptance.
  2. Date of initiation payment.

Defending Champions in either division, regardless of seniority, will be exempted into the Jackman Memorial.

## Local Rules

Please refer to Glen Oak Country Club "Rules of Play" for all local rules.

## Tournament Prize Fund

This fund allows members and their guests to be eligible for prizes in club tournaments. The fee for this fund is \$125.00 and is billed annually. Any member who does not want to participate should notify the office at 570-587-7600.

## Hole-In-One Club

All golf members will be charged a \$5 fee, which will be added to your Club bill. This fee is renewed with each hole-in-one, if you have a hole-in-one at Glen Oak, the money in the club fund will be distributed to you in the form of cash, Golf Shop Credit and Club House credit. Any member who does not wish to participate should notify the office at 570-587-7600.

## Hole In One Rules

1. The ace must be made at Glen Oak.
2. Albatrosses / Double Eagles will not qualify going forward.
3. The shot must be struck from that day's assigned **permanent** teeing ground to the **permanent** green of the same hole.
4. Juniors are eligible to participate in the club.

## Golf Shop Credit

In Club tournaments, prizes will consist of credit in the Golf Shop.

Such "Tournament Credit" is applied to accounts of members and their guests to be used on future purchases of merchandise or repairs, but is not applicable to lessons.

## Leagues

In the interest of the spirit of competition, the fostering of camaraderie and maximizing usage of the facility, Glen Oak hosts a very popular league program. The Leagues are as follows:

### **Glen Oak Country Club Ladies Golf Association:**

Season: Tuesday mornings, May 4 – September 14  
18 or 9 holes, varying formats. Most events are 9:00 shotgun starts.

### **Tuesday Night Men's Twilight:**

Regular Season: April 27 – August 24  
9 hole handicap league, with a better ball of partners format. Tee times from 2:30 – 6:00 on holes 1 & 10.

### **Wednesday Ladies Twilight:**

Regular Season: May 5 – September 8  
9 holes, handicapped, better ball of partners, match play, tee times between 4 and 5 off both sides.

### **Thursday Men's Scratch:**

Regular Season: April 29 – August 25  
Two man teams, 9 holes played at scratch, tee times 3:00 – 6:00 on holes 1 & 10.

People wishing to play on league days should check with the professional staff on course availability, especially when hosting guests. Please let them assist you in scheduling the optimal times to play.

## Golf Handicaps

Glen Oak Country Club, in conjunction with the Golf Association of Philadelphia, maintains handicaps for members in compliance with the World Handicap System. Handicap cards and score history can be obtained through the Golf Shop or printed using the online GHIN service. Handicaps are revised daily under the World Handicap System.

**Basic Premises** - Two basic premises underlie the World Handicap System, namely that each player will try to make the best score on every hole in every round regardless of where the round is played and that the player will post every acceptable round for peer review.

**Posting Scores** - Glen Oak requires that all acceptable scores be posted whether played at home (Glen Oak) or away at other courses. This includes rounds played out of state, e.g., Florida during the winter. Scores should be posted using the computer in the Golf Shop upon completion of the round, or if it is an away round or the Golf Shop is closed, as soon as possible via other computer ([www.ghin.com](http://www.ghin.com)) or the GHIN mobile app. The GHIN system may now also be accessed through your Foretees account. Since handicaps are revised daily under the World Handicap system it is imperative that postable scores are recorded as soon as possible after completion of the round.

You may post only home scores through Foretees. If you belong to multiple golf clubs, scores must be combined in the player's scoring record to yield a single Handicap Index. This can be done by posting scores individually or automatically combining scores using the GHIN services. The Golf Shop staff can assist you.



Nine hole scores are a part of the player's scoring record and must be posted with the same diligence as posting 18 hole scores (provided that the golf course provides a course and slope rating for the nine holes played.)

League scores and Tournament scores will be posted by the Golf Shop staff. Tournament scores will be posted by the Golf Shop staff for the events listed in this Handbook when the event conditions and format are appropriate as outlined by the World Handicap System.

Tournament scores will be recorded for some "better ball" Tournaments, for both players of a team (see above for recording scores for holes not completed).

Incomplete Scores - If you play 13 or more holes in a round, you must report an 18 hole score (seven or more of a nine hole round).

Add the total of par for the holes not completed plus any handicap strokes applicable to those holes, to the ESC score for the round.

If better ball or match play allows you to pick up before completing the play of a hole, record the score most likely to have been made, subject to the ESC maximum.

Equitable Stroke Control (ESC) - All scores are subject to ESC, which is used when a player's score on a hole exceeds the maximum allowable score. The maximum allowable score for any hole is par + 2 + any handicap strokes that would be assigned at 100% of allowance. This can also be understood as net double-bogey.

The Glen Oak active season for handicap score posting runs from April 1 through November 14.

Handicap Committee - The Handicap Committee at Glen Oak functions as a sub-group of the Glen Oak Golf Committee. The committee reviews score posting, handicap revisions, and generally ensures compliance with the World Handicap System.

The Handicap Committee, in conjunction with the Golf Committee, will issue adjusted handicaps to members, as well as guest competitors in Glen Oak events, as necessary, to enforce the World Handicap System.

Circumstances such as a player's routinely failing to post scores (including away scores), score manipulation, inadequate score history, etc., may result in such action.

## **Emergency Situations**

Glen Oak is prepared to aid golfers in emergency situations. In the event of an emergency the following procedures should be followed:

- **Injury on the Course, Clubhouse or Pool**
  - Locate a member of the Glen Oak Staff to treat with first aid supplies.
- **Heart attack or life-threatening situation on Course, Clubhouse or Pool**
  - Locate a member of the Glen Oak Staff to utilize AED and immediately call 911.

## **AED Locations**

Glen Oak is equipped with two (2) automated external defibrillators (AED) which are high tech, yet easy to use devices, to help save the life of someone in cardiac arrest. The devices will be located in the Bag Room and the Grill Room Hallway.

## **New Member Orientation**

All new members will receive a copy of the Member Handbook & Tournament Directory along with their initial letter of welcome.

The welcoming letter will stipulate that each new member (including juniors) wishing to play the course must be certified by the Golf Professional.

The Golf Professional will contact new members in order to acquaint them with the golf course, services, facilities, and proper respect for the course guidelines. If possible, the Golf Professional or his assistants will meet with new members to familiarize them with the local rules and etiquette.

## **Suspension of Golfing Privileges**

- A.** Should a violation or infraction of the Golf Course Rules and Regulations occur, the offending party will be personally notified by the appropriate Committee Chairperson; for example, infraction of Golf Cart Rules would be handled jointly by the Golf Committee Chairperson and the Green Committee Chairperson

The infraction will be explained in detail along with any corrective action that must be taken as appropriate. A record of this meeting will be placed in the member's file. The recommendation for corrective action may include, but is not limited to, warning, probation or suspension of membership privileges at Glen Oak Country Club.

- B.** If a grievance has been filed against a member, he/she will have the right to a hearing with the Grievance Committee Chairperson present their explanation as they relate to the grievance.
- C.** Decisions by the Grievance Committee will be recommended to the Board of Directors for approval at the next possible meeting of the board. If the recommendation of the Grievance Committee includes a suspension of membership privileges, the member has the right to meet with the Board of Directors to appeal said recommendation. It is emphasized that these are guidelines for suspension of golfing privileges. However, the Board of Directors has the right to immediately suspend any member for a severe violation such as the endangerment of the health and safety of other members or the wanton abuse or destruction of club property.

**Green**

## **Green Committee Roles and Responsibilities**

A Golf Course Standards document has been developed by the golf course superintendent and the green committee. These guidelines are intended to inform the membership as to how the golf course and surrounding properties will be maintained. It is important to note that fiscal responsibility plays a major part in achieving these standards.

Included in the maintenance practices are:

- Guidelines and cultivation goals for fairways, greens, tees, roughs, bunkers and grounds.
- Maintenance and management of golf carts.
- Communicating with the membership about current maintenance activities as well as those being planned for the future
- Enhancing awareness of the membership's concerns and publicizing measures taken to address them by using bulletin boards, monthly newsletters, informal question and answer sessions, as well as any other modes of communication that are appropriate.
- Renewed emphasis on developing and maintaining respect for our golf course on the part of every member.

The Golf Course Standards document is available to the membership.

## **Respect for the Course**

It is important for all golfing members to understand that they have an individual responsibility to help preserve and improve the beauty and playability of our golf course.

The following regulations apply:

- Please replace and tamp down all divots, whether on the fairway, rough or tee. Boxes containing soil & seed mixtures have been provided on certain tees. Please fill all divots with the mixture.
- We need your help with repairing ball marks; often your ball mark is in front of the green while your ball may have rolled to the back; please find and fix your ball mark and two others.
- Bunkers must be raked and smoothed. Take care to rake all your footprints.
- Please do not litter our course; if you see litter, pick it up just as you would on your own lawn.
- Never throw clubs or damage the course in frustration over a missed shot.
- The use of non-metal spikes is mandatory to minimize wear on the grounds and the Clubhouse.

## **Wet Weather Cart Operations**

Only under certain wet conditions will carts be restricted to cart paths or areas indicated.

The Course Superintendent will establish temporary roping to protect the course as required. Carts must stay on the cart paths wherever provided and must never drive onto any fairway or rough areas which have been roped. Failure to observe these rules during WET WEATHER conditions could result in suspension of playing privileges.

## **Practice Areas**

- All practice shall be confined to the areas provided for that purpose.
- At no time shall practice, particularly pitching and sand bunker shots, be permitted on the golf course.
- Please refer to the Junior Hours section for rules regarding use of the practice areas by juniors.

### **DRIVING RANGE:**

The range will be opened or closed according to the discretion of the Golf Professional.

### **PUTTING GREEN:**

The putting green adjacent to the Golf Shop is strictly reserved for putting only.

No chipping or pitching is permitted in this area.

### **PUTTING AND CHIPPING GREEN:**

This area near the # 1 back tee is reserved for practice putting and chipping. Chipping is restricted to a distance of 5 yards from the green.

Pitching is strictly prohibited

### **BUNKER AND PITCHING AREA:**

All sand and pitching practice is restricted to this area near the #3 green. Putting and chipping are also permitted. Please repair all ball marks and rake the bunkers after use of this practice area.



## Adopt-a-Hole

In an effort to assist with course maintenance during the upcoming golf season, we would like to encourage the continued involvement of the entire membership in our ADOPT A HOLE program.

Adopting an individual green for you to repair several extra ball marks, replace any divots on tees and fairways, plus picking up any misplaced litter, will make our course more playable and a little neater.

If your last name begins with the letter assigned to a specific hole, you have formally adopted that hole without any official paperwork!

When you are playing the course, please take an extra few moments on your “adopted hole”.

Dinner reservations are requested to ensure better service for everyone.

## **Snow Bird Exception**

Any member who is residing out of state during any two (2) consecutive billing months March thru December can apply for the "Snow Bird" monthly minimum billing cycle. The "Snow Bird" billing cycle will consist of a \$170.00 monthly food and beverage minimum billed each month for five (5) consecutive months beginning with May and ending with September.

Application for this alternate monthly minimum can be submitted to the Glen Oak office for review by the Board of Directors. Applications must be submitted by March 1st for consideration.

For clarification: If you are away at least March and April, or October and November, or November and December, or December and March, you may qualify for the exception.

- No party may reserve two consecutive times.
- All members must sign in their guests; guest charges will be \$5.00 on weekdays and \$7.50 per person on weekends and holidays.
- If a party arrives late for their reservation, their time will be given to any member waiting to use the courts.
- When your time has expired, you may finish the game (not set) that you are playing.
- Children (18 and under) may not reserve, but may use the courts on weekends. However, they must relinquish courts if adults want to play.
- The tennis key is located in the Pool Office.



## Pool Regulations and Hours

The pool will be open from 11:00am to 8:00pm on weekdays, weekends & holidays from Memorial Day weekend through the Labor Day Weekend, weather permitting. Enjoy the pool and please respect all requests from the lifeguards. They are there to protect you.

- Each member must sign in with the lifeguard immediately upon entering the pool area.
  - All guests must be signed in with the lifeguard immediately upon entering the pool area. Pool guest fees: \$5 for child, \$10 for adult and \$15 for family.
  - Bona fide baby-sitters will not be charged guest fees as long as they are in the water with their employer's children.
  - No running at poolside. Exit pool using the steps, not the side of the pool.
  - Shoes must be worn at all times when leaving the pool area.
  - Everyone must wear cover-ups when going to the club house patio area.
  - Adults must accompany children who cannot handle their own body functions to the locker room.  
*(Containers are available for dirty diapers. At no time should diapers be changed at poolside.)*
  - Parents or guardians **MUST** accompany all children under 12.
  - Children with bubbles or other swimming aids are not allowed in the deep end.
  - Members are expected to help keep the pool area clean.
- \* Members are not permitted to bring food or beverages from outside the Club. If you have a special request please inform the General Manager. Food & beverage can be purchased at the poolside cafe.

## **Waves Pool Bar**

The Waves Pool Bar will open in April as soon as weather permits and will remain open through October as long as weather permits:

- No glassware is allowed at the pool, the pool bar or the firepit area.
