# FACILITIES OF GLEN OAK COUNTRY CLUB

Glen Oak Country Club provides its Members an 18 hole golf course that is as challenging as it is beautiful. Nestled in the mountains of Northeastern Pennsylvania, the panoramic view from each tee is one to behold. Our Practice Facility includes a driving range, two putting greens, and bunkers with a practice area. We boast a full service Golf Shop and a professional staff headed by Robert Sedlak, PGA Professional.

Glen Oak maintains two HAR-TRU Tennis courts available for use by our members and their guests. The heated outdoor Swimming Pool is open from Memorial Day until Labor Day and offers a great alternative to beat the summer heat. Programs for children are supervised by our professional lifeguard staff. Lunch and snacks are always available poolside from our Poolside Cafe.

Our unique Clubhouse contains the Main Dining Room, Grill Room, and Bars in both areas. We provide only the finest food, beverage, and camaraderie at Glen Oak Country Club, with a staff dedicated to serving the Membership. Many social events highlight the summer season.

### **BRIEF HISTORY OF GLEN OAK COUNTRY CLUB**

In the 1940's, in response to a need in the community for an alternative country club, a group of prominent businessmen began to search for an appropriate site. The searched started between Scranton and Wilkes-Barre, and finished in the Clarks Summit area.

In September, 1951 the Oakford Estate became available and 16 of our future members came together, each contributing \$100 for an option on the property. The property consisted of approximately 138 acres, a barn, and two bungalows, which are still in use. It also included the main house, which was the Oakford Family summer residence. The closing took place on December 27, 1951.

Harold Phillips became the first President. Ely S. Lipsins was the first secretary. A liquor license was purchased from the Excelsior Club in downtown Scranton. Our club was called the Excelsior Social Club until December 7, 1952, when the name of Glen Oak Country Club was formally adopted.

The Oakford home was converted into a modest dining facility in July 1952. The dining room was added in 1955 and in 1971, the kitchen facilities were greatly expanded. The Main House burned November 25, 1978 and was replaced by a locker room facility. The Dining Room portion of the Clubhouse was completed August 17, 1987.

Soon after the Club was organized, James Harrison, a noted golf course architect, was retained to design the golf course. Work commenced in the summer of 1952 under the direction of Isadore Spitz and Irvine Jackman. The first nine holes, one through five, and 15 through 18 were opened for play October 11, 1953. The remaining nine holes were begun in 1959 and were opened for play June 3, 1961. At that time, the 18 holes were reconfigured to their present sequence.

In May 2001 the club began Phase 1 of its strategic plan. This phase included golf course irrigation with a pond and a brand new Pool House and Poolside Café. In October 2004 the club began the final phase of rebuilding the locker rooms and renovating the Clubhouse. This renovation tied the locker rooms to the current Clubhouse and created the beautiful entrance to the grand building of today.
